How to Find Us:


Littlehampton Museum is located in the heart of the town, just past the bottom of the High Street. The town's beautiful riverside and seafront attactions are just a 15 minute stroll away.

By Rail: Littlehampton Museum is a 5 minute walk from the town's railway station, with an approximate travel time of 1hr 40mins from London, 45 mins from Brighton, and 25 mins from Chichester.

By Bus: The 700 coastal bus route arrives at the Anchor Springs bus terminal, just 2 minutes walk from the museum.

Car Parking: If you want to visit to carry out risk assessments or plan your day in advance, parking disks can be collected from Reception which allow 2 hours free parking at the Manor House Car Park next to the Museum.

Coaches: There is no coach parking at the Museum, but children can be dropped off and collected from Church Street, just outside the main gate. Coach parking is available at the Banjo Road Carpark on the seafront. More information can be found here: arun.gov.uk/littlehampton-car-park-information-charges

- Any special requests


A member of the Museum Team will get back to you to confirm your booking.



Frequently Asked Questions:

- Does the Museum Team run educational sessions?
 We do not currently offer staff led sessions, but you will find resources for self led visits in the 'Learning' section of our website.
- How many children can I bring in one day?
 The maximum group size for children is approx. 30 pupils, or 1 class. We find the galleries get a little too restricted for larger groups than this!
- Do you have toilets? Yes, ground floor toilets will be made available for the duration of your visit.
- Is there a space we can have lunch? In fair weather there is a green space outside the Museum suitable for picnics. An indoor space can occasionally be made available prior notice is essential.
- Do you offer a loan box service for follow up activities? We do! We charge just £5 per week for each loan box. For the full list of our resources please see the 'Learning' page on our website.
